#### National Pricing Formula (NPF) Results Released

The National Pricing Formula (NPF) is used each year as a basis for raw milk price increases. The formula is based 50% on the Cost of Production and 50% on the Consumer Price Index. The <u>results of the formula</u> (an increase of 2.1922%) were released by the Canadian Dairy Commission (CDC) on October 6<sup>th</sup>. CDC held stakeholder consultations this week. As no stakeholder has raised exceptional circumstances this year, it is expected that CDC will formally announce the price adjustment for February 1, 2023 by November 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### **FREE Nutrition Labelling Online Course**

Health Canada is introducing new nutrition labelling regulations for packaged foods requiring a symbol on the front of packages indicating that a food is high in saturated fat, sugars and/or sodium. The regulations came into effect on July 20, 2022. The food industry has been given until January 1, 2026 to comply.
